After exploring Antarctica, the ship sails between icebergs to the South Shetland Islands and through Chilean Patagonia, a breathtaking landscape of snow-capped peaks, glaciers and dramatic fjords. Perfect for: Bucket-listers who want to experience Antarctica in a unique and adrenaline-fuelled way. Belmont Road to Mandalay, Myanmar On board: Myanmar, formerly Burma, is finally opening up to the world, but land travel can still be a nuisance. Enter Belmont's Road to Mandalay, an 82-year-old aerodynamic ship navigating the Ayeyarwady River in great style. No skimp when it comes to luxury amusements: We're talking about a gourmet outdoor restaurant, swimming pool, cocktail bar, spa and boutique, along with entertainment that could include burmese, Burmese puppet shows, dance performances or insightful lectures on Myanmar's fascinating culture.
